



	Provide narrative describing need for capability (i.e. how will this project reduce risk in your jurisdiction?). Nationally there is a rise in emergency service personnel responding to violent incidents. Locally we recently responded to the Wiley Street apartments where 9 victims were stabbed and emergency service personnel were on this scene rescuing, treating and transporting the victims. As a county, all Fire, EMS and LE agencies have developed a formal plan to safely operate on incidents where violent acts have taken place. To prepare for such incidents, partnering agencies have started developing a training and exercise schedule and securing proper equipment to ensure our personnel are able to safely rescue, treat and transport victims. Included in the plan is utilizing a Rescue Task Force (RTF) which will consist of Law Enforcement, Fire and EMS responders deployed in the warm zone of a violent incident to rescue victims through stabilizing bleeding and extracting them to a safe area for additional treatment and transport. Waiting for these areas to be completely safe causes increased mortality of victims. The largest fiscal impact is the equipment needed to be prepared for these types of incidents. Securing grant funding will assist in implementing this program. This specific GPA is to purchase 7 bags to house Rescue Task Force Medical Response Kits for Star Fire Protection District as a participant in the Rescue Task Force.		

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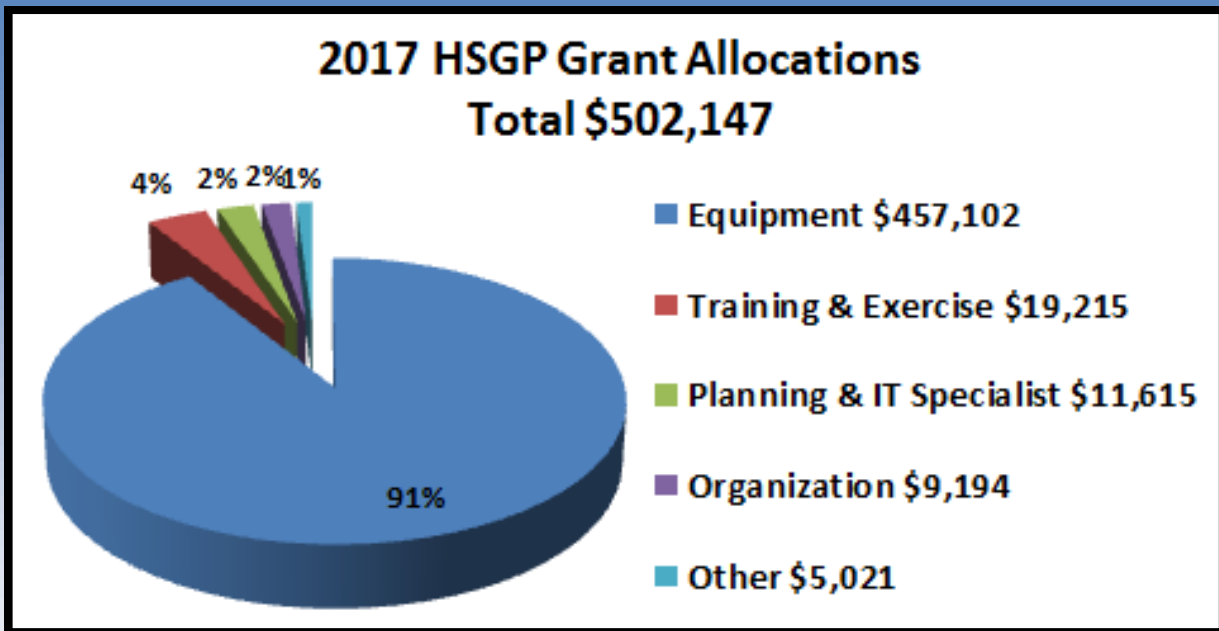
