ACTION ITEMS

New Business

Ann Callahan from ARC briefed the LEPC on the need to increase/enhance mass care capability and requested the use of homeland security grant funds for a new Emergency Response Vehicle (ERV). This vehicle would ultimately replace the old ERV that has outlived its usefulness and is costing excessive funds to keep maintained. She highlighted how the vehicle could have been a valuable regional asset responding to this spring's widespread flooding. All in attendance were in agreement such an asset would enhance service to evacuees and individuals impacted by a disaster.

INFORMATION / DISCUSSION ITEMS

• Overview of the Spring Flooding Event 2017

Doug provided an overview of the preliminary after action report developed from the spring flooding event. He walked the attendees through 101 days of countywide flooding and the efforts undertaken along the Boise River.

• Preliminary After Action Report for Spring Flooding Event 2017

Joe shared the preliminary AAR for the 2017 spring flooding event and EOC activation. He also provided some of the data obtained from the survey that was conducted which helped to develop the AAR. He then went on to explain the recommendations provided from the LEPC Training & Exercise committee for building future critical preparedness capabilities.

• Current and Future Planning Efforts

Crash gave an update on current and future planning projects such as the Flood Plan, Emergency Operations Plan and Standard Operation Procedures in the EOC. He also spoke to policy level changes made during the flood event and stated that there would be additional changes coming as well.
