ACTION ITEMS

Crash welcomed all attendees to the meeting, then provided a brief overview of the agenda.

New Business

Captain Dana Borquist briefed the LEPC on the need to allocate resources for achieving an increased security posture for the Public Safety Building/Jail Complex. He included information on the types of technology and physical systems required to adequately protect critical infrastructure components at the complex, including the County Jail, Emergency Operations Center, and 911 Dispatch Center

INFORMATION / DISCUSSION ITEMS

• Update on EOC status and current Flood Operations

Crash Marusich provided an overview of the current status of the Ada County EOC and of activities being conducted by community partners in response to the current high flows in the Boise River.

National Weather Service Brief

Jay Breidenbach of the National Weather Service provided information, current weather, and hydrologic conditions. Jay delivered a weekend forecast and discussed the relationship between the potential future weather conditions and river flows.

• LEPC Social Media Exercise

Joe Lombardo introduced the activity and briefed attendees on the use of SimDeck. SimDeck is an internet based platform used to emulate a social media environment for exercise purposes. Chris Tarantino, Epicenter Media and Training, presented information on the uses and impacts of social media during a disaster event. He led a group discussion on how it could be used in Ada County in a coordinated effort to deliver consistent information to the public.

Chris then facilitated a functional exercise that engaged participants in social media activities occurring in an artificial post-earthquake environment using SimDeck.

The exercise was followed by a brief after action review and discussion.
