# A. Approve June 5, 2017 Minutes

## B. Approve Local Emergency Planning Committee Grant Request

Doug gave an overview of the American Red Cross' grant request for a new Emergency Response Vehicle. Total request \$150,000. Mayor John Evans moved to approve the ARC grant request. Mayor Joe Stear seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

Ada County Sheriff Chief Deputy Scott Johnson requested \$250,000 of homeland security grant funds to enhance security and critical infrastructure protection of the Public Safety Building. ACHD Commissioner Goldthorpe moved to approve the ACSO grant request. Councilwoman Maryanne Jordan seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

## C. Approve Technical Advisory Group Grant Request

On behalf of Meridian Police Department, Lieutenant Shawn Harper requested \$65,000 in grant funds to purchase eight night vision devices for their SWAT team. The equipment would allow Meridian's team members to be inter-operable with tactical teams from Boise and Ada Metro. Mayor Joe Stear moved to approve the grant request.
