

City of Eagle Police 2010 Annual Report



EAGLE PROPERTY CRIME INVESTIGATIONS

Eagle residents reported nearly 301 property crimes in 2010, including 61 vehicle burglaries, 41 home burglaries and 53 vandalisms. Nationally, clearance rates for property crimes are generally 18 – 20%. In Idaho, 22% of property crimes were cleared in 2009. With the addition of a second detective in October, City of Eagle Police solved 34% of property crimes in 2010.

Eagle Police detectives partnered with Ada County Sheriff's detectives to identify and arrest five teens and young adults responsible for breaking into nearly 100 vehicles and unlocked garages. The group, arrested in October 2010, admitted to targeting homes in Eagle, Meridian and unincorporated Ada County. The young criminals told investigators they would drive through neighborhoods looking for open garages and unlocked vehicles which allow for quick, easy access. Closing your garage and locking your car and home can prevent you from being the victim of property crime.
